## **Overall objective:**

The overall objective of this course is to provide Immunology graduate students with an opportunity to hear the latest research findings from their peers. All Immunology Graduate students enrolled in the program will present their research.

## Seminar organization:

Each presentation should be about 45-50 min in length to allow a period of 5-10 min for questions and discussion. 2nd year students will be expected to give 20-25 min presentations allowing 5-10 mins for questions. All first-year students will give short 10-15 min presentations following each of their 3 rotations. It is recommended that the seminar should focus on pertinent background, new scientific results not previously presented, and end with conclusions including future directions.

## Grades:

The course is graded S-U and the grade is based on attendance. In addition, each seminar presentation will be evaluated by volunteer faculty who will complete a written evaluation to be placed in the student's graduate folder. Immunology faculty will also provide oral feedback to the student immediately following the seminar.
